the monster eat people!

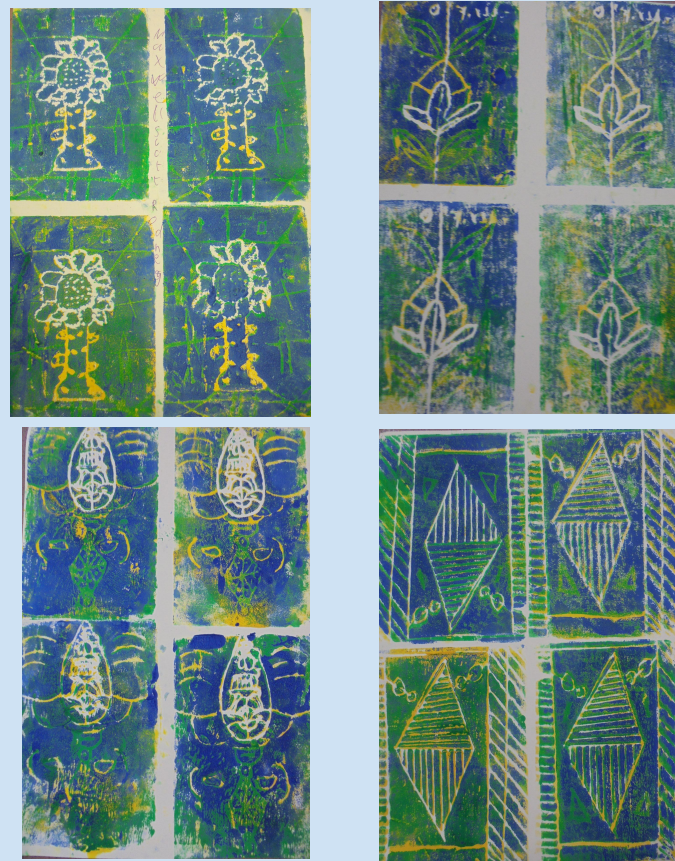
The children have been

Fred says 'fantastic work!' to all the children in Y1 and Y2 - your half termly assessments show you have learnt so much in the last 6 weeks!

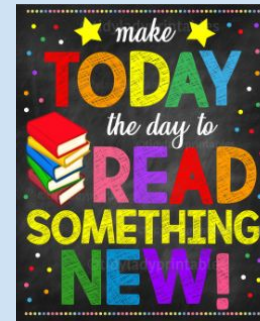
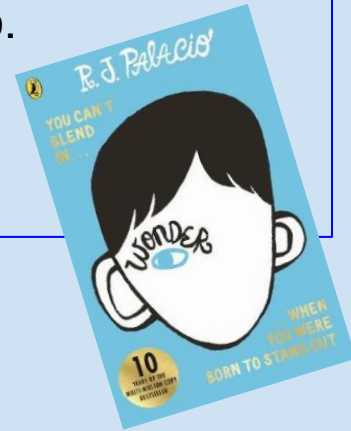
Brilliant Books:
