

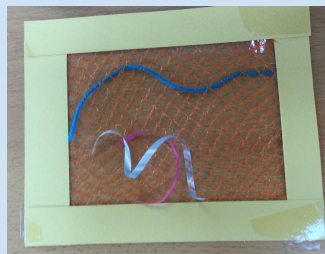


Cavalry Newsletter 02.10.2023
