We are thinking about Days of the Week. Look at these pictures about the questions.

Read the questions and then write the correct day.
Remember days of the week start with a capital letter.

When does Clare go trampolining?

When does Clare watch television?

When does Jack go to the library?

When does Clare go shopping?

When does Jack wash the car?

When does Clare take the dog out?

When does Jack play football?



Now learn how to spell the days of the week and write them in order starting with Monday. Don't forget that capital letter. If you want a challenge write the days of the week in order and write what you would like to do on each day.

Topic

Ask an adult to find you a flower in your garden, or when you're on a walk. Have a good look at it. Can you find the stem, petal and leaves? What else can you see, smell or touch? Now look at any other flowers you have in your garden. Are they all the same? Do they look different? Are they different sizes? Do they all smell the same?

Draw one of your flowers and colour it. Could you draw a few flowers and show which are the biggest and which are the smallest? How many different colours did you find when you found your flower? Why do you think flowers are beautifully coloured and have a lovely scent?
