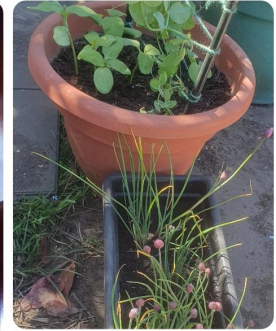

Reception

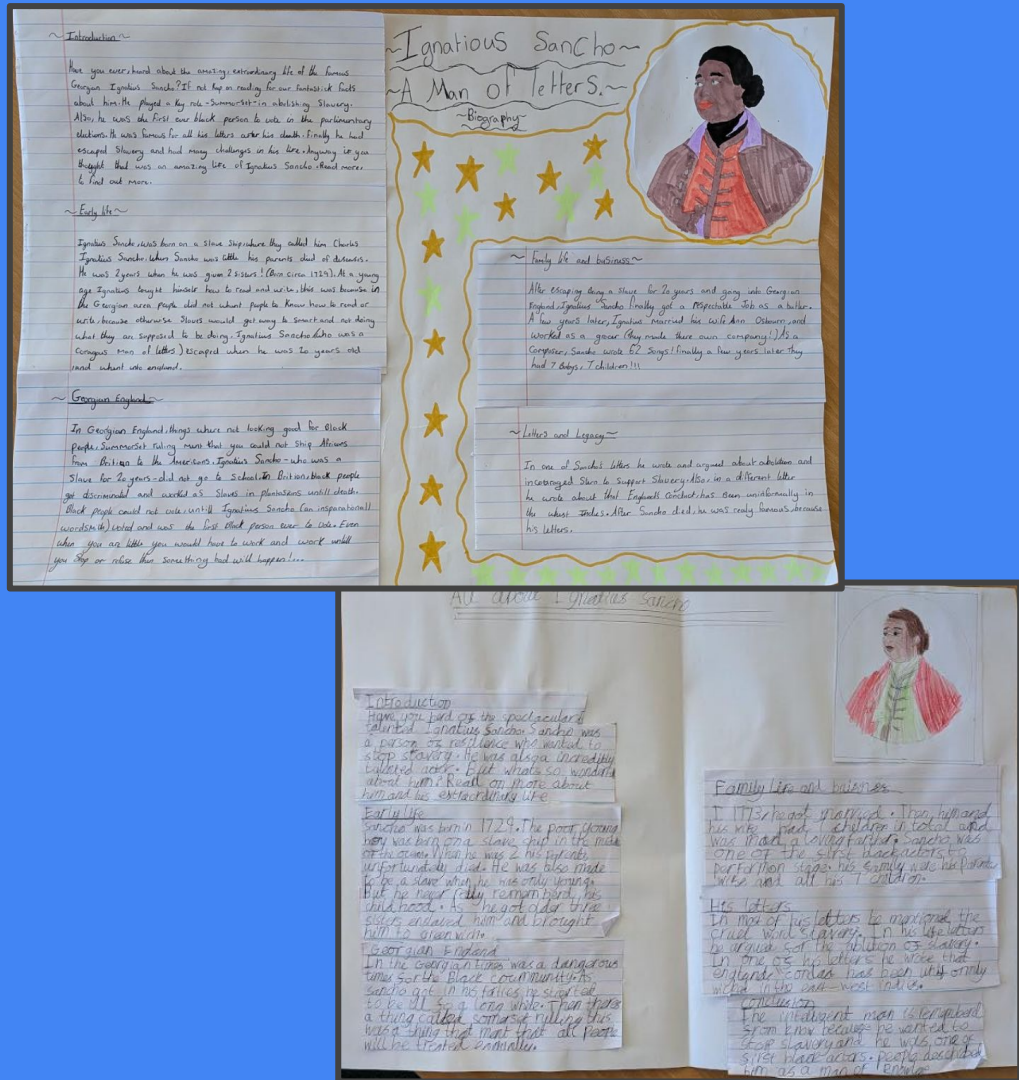
Our Reception pupils have been learning about different life cycles, how different things grow and change. Six weeks ago they planted some seeds. These are now growing and they have noticed different leaves. We have strawberries, peas, beans, chives, potatoes, cucumbers and tomatoes. We can't wait to harvest them during our food festival! We have also been watching as our frogspawn grew and changed into tadpoles. They have developed very round bodies and long tails but no legs yet. Finally, we have had six eggs in an incubator for the past 18 days. We have watched as the incubator slowly rotates the eggs and kept an eye on the temperature and humidity but now it's almost time for them to hatch. This bank holiday the chicks should hatch and we can't wait to see how many we get. We tried 'candling' the eggs and were excited to see veins which means that there should be a chick present! What an EGG-CITING time it is in Reception!

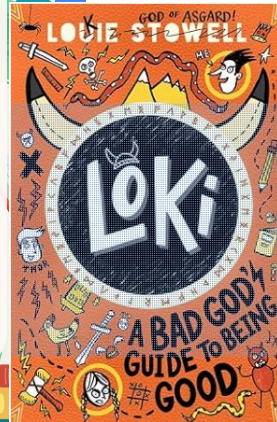

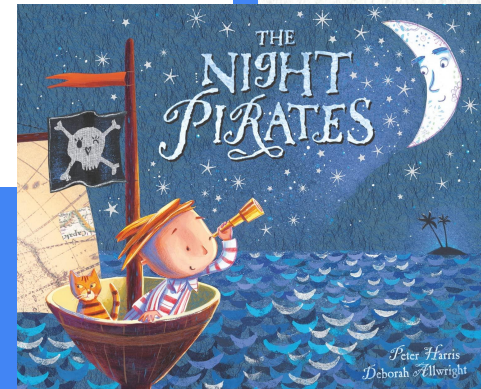
