Professor Sir Simon Baron Cohen from Cambridge University will talk about the new Autism Centre for Excellence which will be working with the County Council. We will hear from Dr Venkat Reddy, Consultant Neurodevelopmental Paediatrician and Lead Clinician for Cambridgeshire and Peterborough Foundation Trust, about how an Autism diagnosis works and the new pathway. Janet Dullaghan, the lead Commissioner, will present the new draft Cambridgeshire's

New Autism Strategy as its prepared for a summer/autumn consultation. Dr Max Davie, from Guys and St Thomas' Hospitals, will explain everything you need to know about ADHD. Kirsten Branigan, the Principal Education Psychologist for Cambridgeshire, will explain how assessments can help identify needs and the process of applying for an ECHA and will be joined by colleagues to share the Dyslexia Guidance for schools.
