
Know Your Numbers!

Can you pick a number under 100, and tell me as many number facts as you can about that number. Here is an example:

64

64 has 6 tens and 4 ones

60 + 4 = 64	64 - 4 = 60	a half of 64 is 32
50 + 14 = 64	64 - 14 = 50	
40 + 24 = 64	64 - 24 = 40	a quarter of 64 is 16
30 + 34 = 64	64 - 34 = 30	
20 + 44 = 64	64 - 44 = 20	64 is an even number
10 + 54 = 64	64 - 54 = 10	
0 + 64 = 64	64 - 64 = 0	64 can be shared into 8 groups of 8



I'm sure that you will be able to think of even more facts for your number! You can show them in any way you like. Use number sentences, part-whole models, bar models, or draw your numbers. Be as imaginative as you can to show us as many facts as you can. If you are not feeling confident, pick a smaller number. Choose a number and have a go!
