

Sports Premium Funding 2017 to 2018 – evaluation of expenditure

Our allocation of Sports Premium Funding amounts to £19,670. The government's guidance about how to spend this money is as follows:

Purpose of funding

Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, but they will have the freedom to choose how they do this.

Possible uses for the funding might include:

- *hiring specialist PE teachers or qualified sports coaches to work with primary teachers when teaching PE*
- *supporting and engaging the least active children through new or additional Change4Life clubs*
- *paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport*
- *providing cover to release primary teachers for professional development in PE and sport*
- *running sport competitions, or increasing pupils' participation in the School Games*
- *buying quality assured professional development modules or materials for PE and sport*
- *providing places for pupils on after school sports clubs and holiday clubs*
- *pooling the additional funding with that of other local schools.*

At Cavalry Primary School it is our priority to spend this money in ways which will have a lasting impact on the quality of Physical Education experienced by all our children.

We expect to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators:

- the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles
- the profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement
- increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport
- broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils
- increased participation in competitive sport
